

- Lunch items needed are ramen noodles (cup and bag), canned chili, SPAM, vienna sausage, soup (chicken/tomato/Progresso).





EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL BULLETIN INFORMATION

WEEK 2

St Catherine of Sienna

Catherine was born March 25th, 1347, in Sienna Italy. Catherine was the youngest of 25 children born to Giacomo and Lapa Benincasa. Catherine's twin sister Giovanna did not survive long after her baptism. At a young age, Catherine committed herself to be a virgin for Christ. At the age of twenty she joined the Lay fraternity of St. Dominic.

Catherine lived a life of fasting and self-denial. She lived a cloistered life in a cell set aside for her in her family home. There she remained alone as a constant companion to Jesus; leaving only to attend Mass. She was truly a spouse to Christ when "...the Blessed Virgin took Catherine's hand in her own and presented the young virgin to her Son, Jesus, asking Him formally to marry Catherine to Himself in faith." [Baldwin; pg33] Shortly after this beautiful union, Catherine was asked by Jesus to leave her cell and walk the path of preaching, teaching and so much more. Miracles began to be associated with Catherine. On One occasion, Catherine gave a stranger her Pater Noster [knotted rope with cross] to a poor man. That night the Lord appeared to Catherine holding the very same cross. Catherine recognized the cross, but noticed it was so much more beautiful. The Lord responded "you gave it to me for the sake of charity and generosity," both symbolized in the precious gems now present on the cross.

St. Catherine fasted for 7 years prior to her death; taking in nothing but Holy Communion. In spite of such severe fasting, she still had energy to do the Will of God, and made pilgrimages to Rome to fight for the Church. Hundreds of people would show at her home and she would patiently listen to them, provided them peace, prayers and healing.

Words of St. Catherine to reflect upon:

"Father, I am hungry: for the love of God give this soul her food, her Lord in the Eucharist."
"Proclaim the truth and do not be silent through fear."
"Be who you were created to be and you will set the world on fire."
"The devil fears hearts on fire with the love of God."

*St. Catherine had a strong devotion to St. Mary Magdalene. We will feature that saint next.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

One of the Vatican Council II's documents is Lumen Gentium (Light of the Nations) and its chapter titled Laity gives light to how we are all called to the mission of the Church: **to be witnesses to the world of the salvific mission in Christ, the Light of the World.** "The laity, by their very vocation, seek the kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God. They live in the world, that is, in each and in all of the secular professions and occupations. They live in the ordinary circumstances of family and social life, from which the very web of their existence is woven. They are called there by God that by exercising their proper function and led by the spirit of the Gospel, they may work for the sanctification of the world from within as a leaven. In this way they may make Christ known to others, especially by the testimony of a life resplendent in faith, hope, and charity. Therefore, since they are tightly bound up in all types of temporal affairs it is their special task to order and to throw light upon these affairs in such a way that they may come into being and then continually increase according to Christ to the praise of the Creator and the Redeemer" (no.31).

All of us are called to build up the Body of Christ and His Kingdom. It is living our life in Christ, strengthened by the Eucharist, that we are members of the Mystical Body of Christ. This weekend we expressed our appreciation and gratitude to our liturgical volunteers who help us at Mass with a Day of Thanks; our Lectors, Ministers of the Eucharist, Ushers, Baptism Ministry, Cleaning Ministry, and Environmental Ministry. In the next several months, we will have Appreciation Celebrations to our other volunteers: our Catechists, Family Ministry, Music Ministry, and Parish Outreach. All of you help make St. Jude Church a beautiful and faith-filled place to worship and give praise God!

Enrollment of **new members** will be held on **Monday, Oct. 2nd at 7pm** in the church.


The applicants must arrive at 6:30 in preparation for the ceremony.

Wine & Cheese refreshments, along with coffee and cake will be served after our meeting in celebration of our new Rosarians.





OCTOBER SAINTS

THÉRÈSE OF LISIEUX - OCT 01

St. Thérèse of Lisieux as the patron saint of the missions. She never traveled, but she loved praying for the missions. People also call her "the Little Flower," because she loved flowers and sometimes called herself a "little flower of Jesus."



FRANCIS OF ASSISI - OCT 04

The patron saint of Italy, Francis of Assisi was a poor little man who astounded and inspired the Church by taking the gospel literally—not in a narrow fundamentalist sense, but by actually following all that Jesus said and did, joyfully, without limit, and without a sense of self-importance.



FAUSTINA KOWALSKA - OCT 05

St. Faustina shared a message about God's love and mercy for all people. After her death, devotion to God's mercy spread to many countries. This brought hope and healing to the lives of other people.



TERESA OF ÁVILA - OCT 15

Teresa was a woman "for others." She founded over a half -dozen new monasteries. She traveled, wrote, fought—always to renew, to reform. In her self, in her prayer, in her life, in her efforts to reform, in all the people she touched, she was a woman for others, a woman who inspired and gave life.



LUKE THE EVANGELIST - OCT 18

Luke was an Evangelist, the writer of the third Gospel. We remember that his Gospel continues to help us know and love Jesus. Luke's Gospel also reminds us to look for ways to imitate Jesus by reaching out to help our brothers and sisters in need.



JOHN PAUL II, POPE - OCT 22

During his nearly thirty-year pontificate, Pope John Paul II established World Youth Day, traveled to over 129 countries, and aided in the downfall of communism in his native Poland. Pope St. John Paul II was canonized in 2014, along with Pope St. John XXIII, by Pope Francis. Pope St. John Paul II is a patron saint of World Youth Day.



JUDE THADDEUS, APOSTLES - OCT 28

Saint Jude, also known as Saint Jude Thaddeus, is known and loved throughout the world as the Patron Saint of Hopeless Causes. He was one of the twelve Apostles and a cousin of Jesus Christ. He courageously preached the Gospel, often in the most difficult circumstances.



CHIARA LUCE BADANO - OCT 29

Chiara died in 1990. Within nine years, the bishop of her diocese began the work on her cause for canonization. Pope Benedict XVI declared her "Blessed" in 2010. She was a normal, everyday girl, and possibly a normal, everyday saint. Chiara's brief life showed us how much one person can accomplish in God's name.




