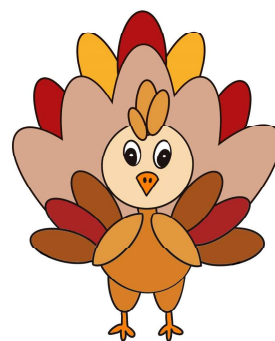

A dictionary definition of revival is an improvement in the condition or strength of something. It just seems strange to see this word with Eucharistic! Is it not the perfect gift from Christ?

a non-partisan non advocacy fact tank purports "*Just one-third of U.S Catholics agree with their church that Eucharist is the body, blood of Christ*".

The Church has called on a National Eucharist Revival to meet this development! At the start of this initiative, Fr. Ryan's "From the Pastor's Desk" quotes from the Catechism of the Catholic Church. 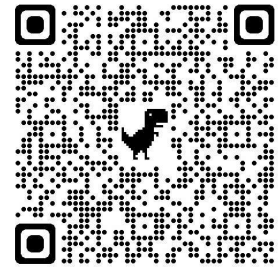

**ST. JUDE THE APOSTLE**  
is visiting the United States

Known as the *Apostle of the Impossible*, Saint Jude is revered for his unwavering dedication and steadfast faith. Millions have experienced his intercession in times of adversity and need.



### THE VISIT OF THE APOSTLE OF THE IMPOSSIBLE

From September 2023 to May 2024, the arm of Saint Jude Thaddeus, venerated in Rome from ancient times, will be on pilgrimage in the United States, making stops in 100 cities.

One of the Church's most beloved saints, Saint Jude is the one to whom people turn when they are desperate and have tried everything else. When things seem lost or unbearable—when they seem hopeless—Saint Jude is the one to whom people often turn.

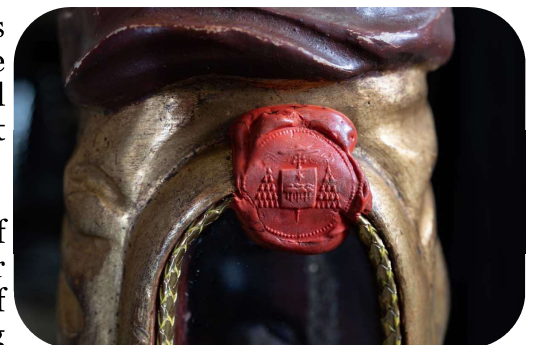
### THE RELIC



The most reliable ancient records identify the place of Saint Jude's martyrdom and burial to be the city of Beirut. Sometime later, his body was transferred to Rome and placed in a crypt within the original Saint Peter's Basilica, completed by the Emperor Constantine (in 333 AD). Today, his remains are in the left transept of the current Basilica (completed in 1626), below the main altar of Saint Joseph, within a tomb also holding the remains of the Apostle Simon. This resting place has become a popular destination for pilgrims who have a devotion to the Apostle of the Impossible.

The arm of the saint, which is making its way across North America as part of this tour, was separated from the greater portion of his remains several centuries ago and placed in a simple wooden reliquary carved in the shape of an upright arm in the gesture of imparting a blessing.

The reliquary was last opened during the time of Cardinal Francesco Marchetti Selvaggiani, who served as Vicar General of His Holiness (Vicar General for the Archdiocese of Rome) from 1931-1951. His seals enclose it, ensuring provenance and authenticity.

You are encouraged to **touch the reliquary** display case. In every instance where Scripture mentions relics, two things occur:

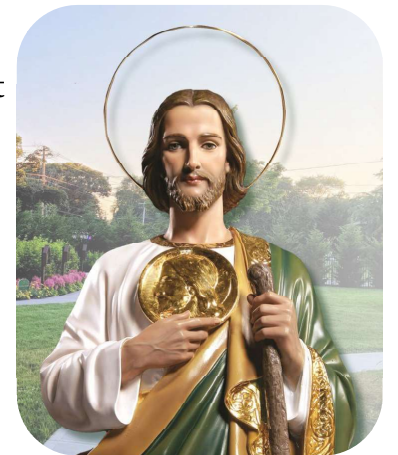
- i) There is always healing.**
- ii) Touch is how the healing comes about.**

You are also encouraged to **touch your objects of devotion** (rosaries, medals, crosses, wedding bands, etc.) to bless them and make them into **third-class relics**. You may also **touch pictures of family members and friends** to invoke Saint Jude's intercession.

***Special Plenary Indulgence Issued by the Vatican***

*The Holy See has issued a plenary indulgence available to all pilgrims who venerate Saint Jude's relics.*

***What is a Plenary Indulgence:*** It is an act by the Pope whereby he uses his authority as the successor of Saint Peter to declare the removal of one's accrued purgation to be spent in Purgatory (an instance of the papal "power of the keys" described in Matthew 16:18-19). A Catholic who gains a plenary indulgence receives a blank slate in terms of Purgatory up to the moment of attaining it.

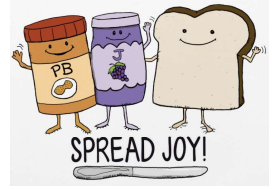

Lord God, You have sustained our nation in the past and continue to bless us. We recall how so many have given their lives for the cause of freedom. Today, we pause to reflect and honor those who gave or who continue to sacrifice so much in the defense of our freedom to be faithful.

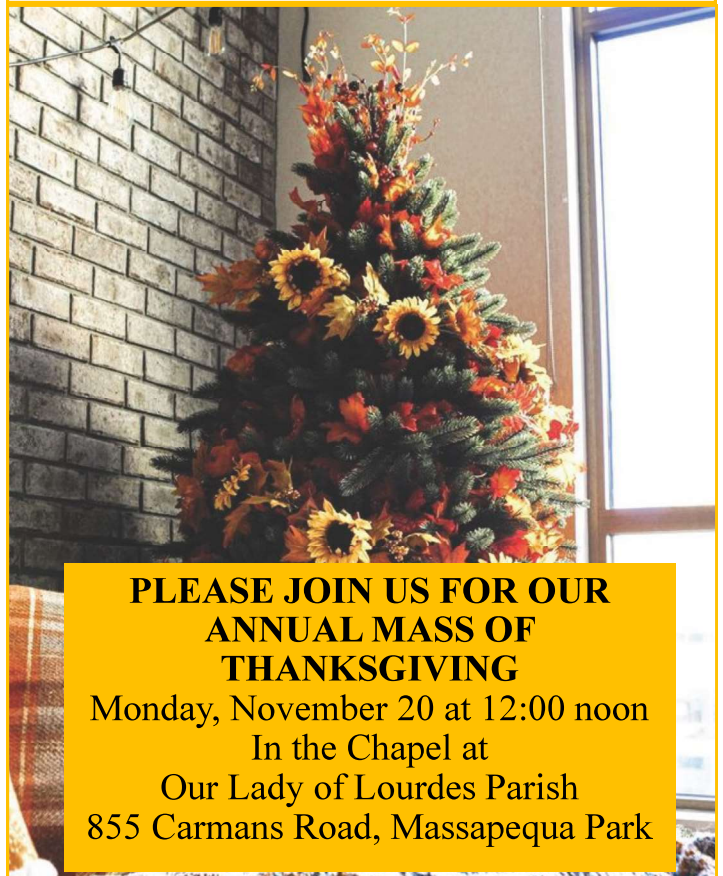
