



WEEK 8

It is without question that no person has changed the world like Jesus of Nazareth. Time is measured from his birth, churches were built to worship him in every corner of the world, cities were named after his followers, and his life has captured countless works of art and literature. Is he a legend, a liar, a lunatic? Or is he who he claimed to be—God in the flesh? Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15). He invites us to answer the question too.




Discussion Questions:

- 1. Jesus Christ is easily the most dominant figure in all of history. That makes no sense at all. A guy that had no money, no armies, no power—the most dominant figure in all of history? Who was this man?
- 2. Jesus asked his disciples], "But who do you say that I am?"... He didn't care what the world said... He cared what they said in their hearts. He cares what you say. Why would Jesus say this?
- 3. To redeem us, he came and entered our experience of life. He was born into a world of death; he was born behind enemy lines. And from within, he changed everything it means to be a human being. How do you approach your crosses in life? Is it how Jesus faced his cross to bear?
- 4. We have more historical evidence about Jesus of Nazareth than we have about most other ancient historical figures that people never call into question. Why are historical facts ignored when people discuss religion in today's world?
- 5. After Jesus of Nazareth died, was crucified, and then rose from the dead... one by one, pagan cities, pagan towns, pagan peoples... began to convert. How can we evangelize (convert or seek to convert to Christianity) in our day to day life?
- 6. These are the three options. Jesus was either a liar, or a lunatic, or he was, in fact, the Lord. And you have to make your choice. What makes you believe that Jesus is the Son Of God.
- 7. All the stuff we do as Christians is not about adding to do's to our already overwhelmingly busy lives. The stuff we do as Christians is about drawing near to the source of life itself. How do you set time aside to focus on your spiritual health?


