





#### **EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL BULLETIN INFORMATION**

#### **WEEK 10**

This week we will be sharing Session Two from the Eucharistic Revival Webinars. The Theme is *Why A Church?* 

We uniquely encounter the love of God in the Church Jesus established for us. Jesus didn't simply leave us a message or instructions to follow. Jesus offers us the Church, his Mystical Body, so that through her we may share with him in his divine life. She makes Jesus present to us through a profound, unbreakable, mysterious continuity with him. She offers trustworthy and authoritative teaching, handing on all that God has revealed, and helps us apply it to our lives today. She contains and communicates his grace, manifesting God's love for us and helping us on our earthly pilgrimage to the heavenly Jerusalem. What a gift!

#### **Discussion Questions.**

- 1. The Church is essentially a way for us to encounter the presence of God that we need to live life to the full. It's the place where we can look for authoritative teaching, interpreting all that he left us and helping us to apply it to our lives today. How has the church affected your life?
- 2. What the research shows is that people who went through their life connected to a community... ended up physically and emotionally in much better shape than their peers. As a Catholic, this research is no surprise to me, that we were made by relationship for relationship. Fr Ryan says this often in his homily, "we are social beings". What can you do to become a bigger part of your church community?
- 3. The fact that God saves us as a family means... that we have an organized religion. Religion was never meant to be a private, personal thing. Private prayer is important and necessary, but community prayer is equally as important. Do you attend holy hours and other prayer services? How can you incorporate community prayer more into your life? Even if it's just once a month.
- 4. We see a lot in the scandal that has happened in the Church. There are many people who have been deeply, deeply hurt... This is a crisis and stuff that should have never happened... When sin happens... our God is an incredible source of love and healing. How do you react to other people who say they stopped going to church due to these scandals? How can you bring people back to the church community?
- 5. Receiving the Eucharist on Sunday is a big deal because I believe it is what Jesus says it is. How can you bring more people to the Eucharist?
