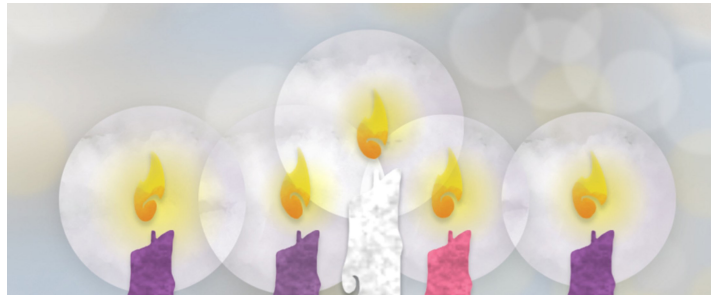

Bulletin Reflection

In today's Gospel, we are introduced to John the Baptist who came and proclaimed the coming of Jesus Christ.

St. Vincent de Paul

John the Baptist knew the Advent secret: He focused his whole life on the coming of Jesus. He realized that his all-consuming vocation was to prepare the way of the Lord. Our own vocation is very similar. Saint Vincent tells us that the person of Jesus must be absolutely central in our lives, as it was for following Christ. We seek to share in his love and reverence for the Father and his compassionate and effective love for the poor. With him we trust in God's providence, which rules over all. For Vincentians, as for John the Baptist, there is nothing else but Jesus.

EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL BULLETIN INFORMATION

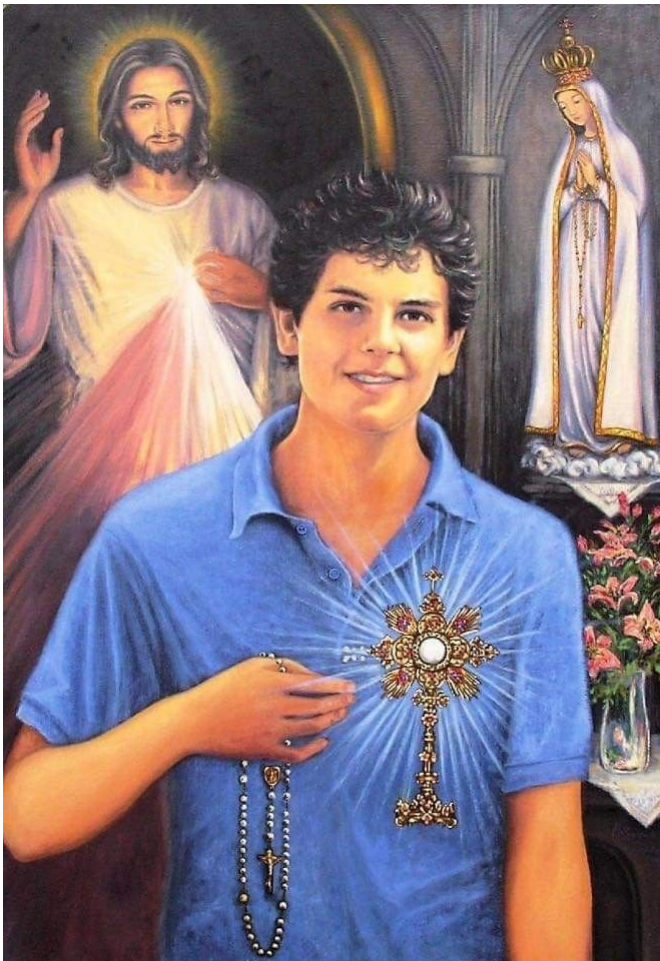

The PEW Research Center, (Gregory A. Smith), reports that just one third of U.S. Catholics agree with their church that the Eucharist is the body and blood of Christ. The survey also finds that belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist is most common among older Catholics but majorities in every age group (including 61% of those aged 60 and over) believe that the bread and wine are symbols, not the actual body and blood of Christ.”

Can one imagine what Saint Paul would say to them?

The study also revealed that an approximate similar percentage of the sample group do not know church teaching on transubstantiation. Very sad!

The Catholic faith is not a buffet of beliefs from which one can pick and choose. It involves discipline, obedience, faith, love, hope and charity, to say the least! Is it hard? Jesus, the Apostles and martyrs and saints practiced what is hard!



If you have access to a computer or smart phone, you can do a web search of Blessed Carlo Acutis, (May 3, 1991 –October 12, 2006). He was an English-born Italian teenager and website designer who is best known for documenting Eucharistic miracles and the approved Marian apparitions around the world and cataloguing them onto a website and as an exhibition which he created before his death from leukemia. www.miraculiecarloacutis.org and www.miracolieucaristici.org.

He was noted for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and deep devotion to the Eucharist, which became a core theme of his life. He was beatified by the Catholic Church on October 10, 2020, two days before the 14th anniversary of his death. (The foreward of Cardinal Angelo Comastri quotes Carlo of having said “to always be close to Jesus, that’s my life plan”)

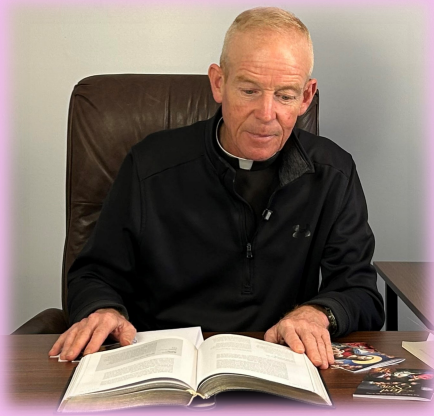

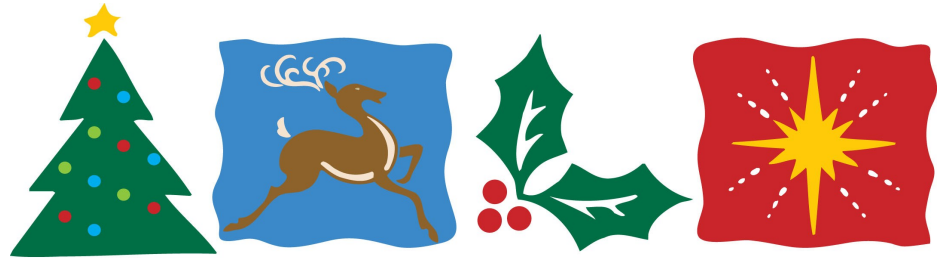
