EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL BULLETIN INFORMATION

WEEK 14



Session 6 is titled “The Story of The Eucharist.” The video will begin with a Lectio Prayer. Lectio Divina is a way to pray that includes reading a part of the bible and reflecting on it. This week’s reading will be Luke 24: 13–16, 27-33 | The Appearance on the Road Emmaus.

Lessons for this week.

I. John 6 – Bread of Life Discourse

- A. Jesus explicitly teaches on the Eucharist. Jesus said “I am the living bread that came down from heaven... and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.” (Jn 6:51)
- B. Many followers leave Jesus over this teaching. Jesus responded, “unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you.” (Jn 6:53)
- C. This teaching is so central to his mission that Jesus lets them leave.
- D. Only the twelve remain. Jesus asks them, “Do you

also want to leave?” (Jn 6:67). Peter gives the ultimate response of faith: “Master, to whom should we go? You have the words of eternal life.” (Jn 6:68)

II. The Story of Scripture

- A. In the Garden of Eden, God’s plan is for Adam and Eve to become one with him by eating from the Tree of Life.
- B. Adam and Eve chose to disobey God’s command and ate from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil in an attempt to be like God. Instead of enjoying communion with God for all eternity, they sever their communion with God through a meal.
- C. This sacrament has been given many names: the Lord’s Supper, the Breaking of the Bread, the Holy Sacrifice, Holy Communion, and it is most commonly called the Mass or Eucharist (from the Greek word meaning thanksgiving).
- D. Original sin separated us from God and the fullness of life he wished to impart to us, but God gave us a savior.

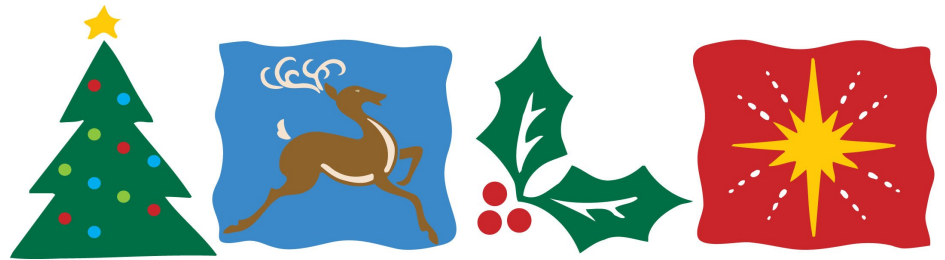
