

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL BULLETIN INFORMATION

WEEK 15



Session 7 is titled Bread for the Journey. The video will begin with a Lectio Prayer. Lectio Divina is a way to pray that includes reading a part of the bible and reflecting on it. This weeks reading will be Matthew 28:16–20 | The Commissioning of the Disciples.

Lessons for this week.

I. Food for the Journey

A. God gives the Israelites manna for their journey in the wilderness. B. The Eucharist is true bread from heaven that sustains us on our spiritual journey.

- C. The Eucharist is also a foretaste of heaven.
- 1. We receive Christ, who is our ultimate Love.
- 2. We are brought into communion with God and with everyone else who is in communion with God.
- 3. In the Mass, we worship God together with all the angels and saints in heaven.

II. The Mass

- A. Liturgy of the Word
- 1. We encounter God in Scripture.
- 2. We respond in faith through the Creed and the Prayers of the Faithful.

B. Liturgy of the Eucharist

1. In the Liturgy, the bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus, and his whole Paschal Mystery is made present in the Eucharist

- 2. The climax of the liturgy for each of us is when we worthily receive Jesus in Holy Communion,
- "who makes us sharers in his Body and Blood to form a single body" (CCC, no. 1331).

C. Story of Emmaus

- 1. The story of Emmaus shows us the meaning and pattern of the Mass—Word and Sacrament.
- 2. Liturgy of the Word—Jesus interprets the Scriptures for the disciples.
- 3. Liturgy of the Eucharist—Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives the bread.
- III. Rules for receiving the Eucharist
- A. Never receive the Eucharist in a state of mortal sin (see 1 Corinthians 11:27–29).

B. Fast from food and drink (except water or medicine) for at least one hour before receiving the Eucharist. (There is an exception for the elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them—see Code of Canon Law #919, para. 3).

C. Receive the Eucharist at least once a year during the Easter season.



The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

The Epiphany marks the arrival of visitors, identified in Scripture as the magi, to the place where Jesus was born. Although we know virtually nothing about them, we do know they brought three gifts:

- Gold a symbol of wealth and power, identifies the recipient as a king.
- Frankincense the crystalized resinous sap of a tree used as incense and as an offering, is symbolic of prayer.
- Myrrh another resinous tree sap, was used in healing liniments and as an embalming ointment. Myrrh is an odd gift for a child—so, even at the beginning of Jesus' life on earth, this gift foreshadows his death.

Reflect

For much of the secular world, the holiday season has died down. Reflect with this article on the joys of the holiday season and what you have left to celebrate when the decorations are put away.

The Baptism of the Lord

It happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." $\sim Mark 1:9-11$

The Church commemorates the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist. On this occasion, Jesus entered into His ministry and acquired His first disciples, St. John proclaimed Christ the Lamb of God, whose way he had prepared, and the Triune nature of the Godhead was manifested. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a liturgical bridge that connects the Christmas season to Ordinary Time. During the Christmas season we pondered the Incarnation, Nativity, Presentation in the Temple, and Epiphany.
