
FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Preparing for Lent

While Christmas may seem to have only been just a few weeks ago, we are now entering a new season in the Church's calendar-Lent. As we begin our Lenten journey, let's try our best to grow closer to the Lord! We hope that you take advantage of this time to grow deeper in your faith, and we invite you to use the Pillars of Stewardship to help you:

Using the **Pillar of Service**, you can take this time to give to those in need. Perhaps, if finances permit, you can increase your weekly giving to your parish-- just one dollar extra a week can make a difference in your parish's finances.

Using the **Pillar of Hospitality**, you could not only volunteer your time to help others in need, but you could also use your time to visit someone who may be feeling lonely. Oftentimes, we forget that one of the greatest gifts we can give someone is just the gift of our time. Greet the Priest Make the sign of the cross. Say "Bless me Father, for I have sinned. My last confession was...



WEEK 21 Third Apparition of the Angel of Peace in Fatima, Portugal

The Little Shepherds were tending their sheep in an olive grove. After lunch, they knelt down to pray with their foreheads touching the ground, as the Angel of Peace had taught them to do during his first visit.

They prayed the "Pardon Prayer" many times. Suddenly, an extraordinary light shone on them! They jumped up and saw the Angel. He was holding a chalice with his left hand and the Sacred Host above it. Drops of Blood were falling into the chalice from the Host. The Angel left the chalice and Host suspended in the air, and together with the Little Shepherds, he knelt and bowed down.



The Angel taught the Little Shepherds this powerful prayer of adoration and reparation:

Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly, and I offer You the Most Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. And by the infinite merits of His most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg the conversion of poor sinners.




