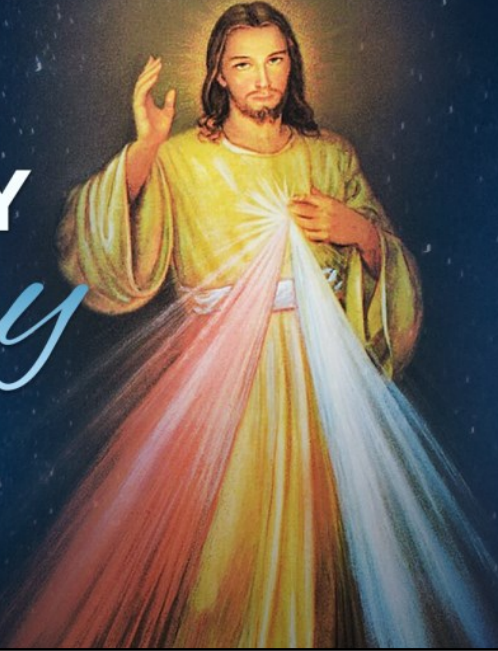

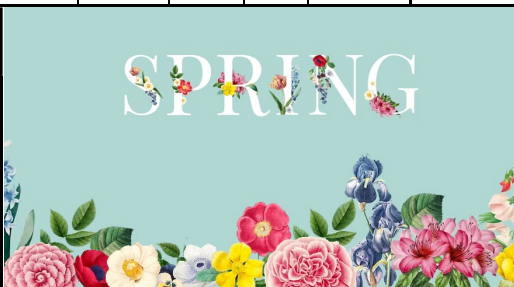

The **FEAST** of **DIVINE MERCY**

— 4 KEY POINTS —

“My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy.”

Diary entry 699

1 The **FEAST** of **DIVINE MERCY**

Saint Faustina Kowalska was a Polish nun who received mystical revelations in which Jesus showed her his heart, **the source of mercy** and expressed his wish that this feast was celebrated. Therefore, she is known as **the messenger of Divine Mercy**.

The **FEAST** of **DIVINE MERCY** **2**

The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued on May 23, 2000 a decree (**at the suggestion of St. John Paul II**) in which the feast of Divine Mercy would be celebrated each year on **the second Sunday of Easter**.

3 The **FEAST** of **DIVINE MERCY**

In order to celebrate this day, it is recommended to **pray the Chaplet and the Novena of the Divine Mercy**, go to **confession** (after a deep examination of conscience), and to **receive Holy Communion** on the day of the Feast of Divine Mercy.

The **FEAST** of **DIVINE MERCY** **4**

The main purpose of the Feast of Divine Mercy is to send the entire world an important message: **God is merciful and He loves us all.**

Represents **Christ Resurrected** who illuminates our path and **destroys our sins.**

Flame
Sharing this flame symbolizes the **faith** that we **receive** and pass on to **others.**

Nails

God is the **beginning** and the **end.**

Year
God is **Lord** and **Master** of all **eternity.**

Lamb

April 5th: St. Vincent Ferrer PATRON OF BUILDERS

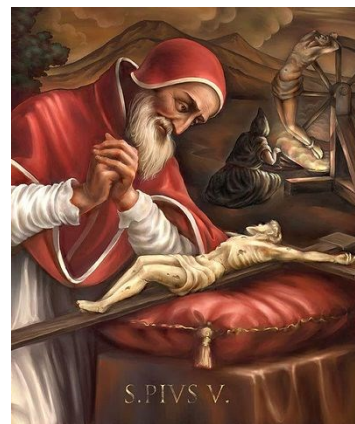
Born January 23, 1357 in Valencia Spain. Like St. Jude, he is known for miracles in times of hopelessness; with 878 credited to his intercession. St. Vincent was a fervent preacher, spreading the Book of revelation and the need to convert. He preached all over Spain, Italy, France, and Germany as well as other places. Entrust your concerns to St. Vincent Ferrer, the intercessor for difficult cases.



April 29th: St. Catherine of Sienna

PATRON OF EUROPE, ITALY, NURSES, THE SICK and THOSE RIDICULED FOR THEIR PIETY.

Born in Siena Italy, the 23rd of 24 children! At the age of 16 she joined the Lay Fraternity of Saint Dominic. At the age of 21, she experienced a “mystical marriage” to Jesus. She preferred to stay alone and contemplate Our Lord, but he asked that she go out and care for those in need. She fought to bring the Pope back to Rome and was preaching to people wherever she traveled. She left us her *Dialogue of Divine Providence, a book written in ecstasy between a soul and the father in Heaven.*



April 30th: St. Pope Pius the V

PATRON OF MALTA and RELEVANCE in LITURGIES IN 1566, Michele Ghislieri was elected Pope and took the name Pius V. He was a devout Dominican Friar from Italy. He played a key role in the reforms made during the Council of Trent. He opened seminaries, issued a new catechism and missal. He expected reverence during the liturgy and prayers. Pope Pius V is also known for his Marian devotion.
