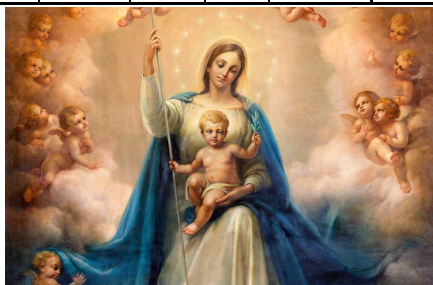

Bulletin Reflection

Today we celebrate Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles.

St. Vincent de Paul



While at times one can hear the Spirit speak even in a noisy crowd, it is often only in silence that one hears the deepest voice, that one plumbs the depth of meaning. It is only when what is heard is pondered, that its full meaning is revealed. The quest for truth, therefore, involves prayerfulness and reflectiveness. Jesus turned to his Father again and again in prayer to listen to him and to seek his will. Prayer is then surely one of the privileged ways of listening. But it must always be validated by life. One who listens to “what the Spirit is telling me” in prayer, but who pays little heed to what others are saying in daily life is surely suspect. Prayer must be in contact with people and events, since God speaks not only in the silence of our hearts, but also (and often first of all) in the people around us. 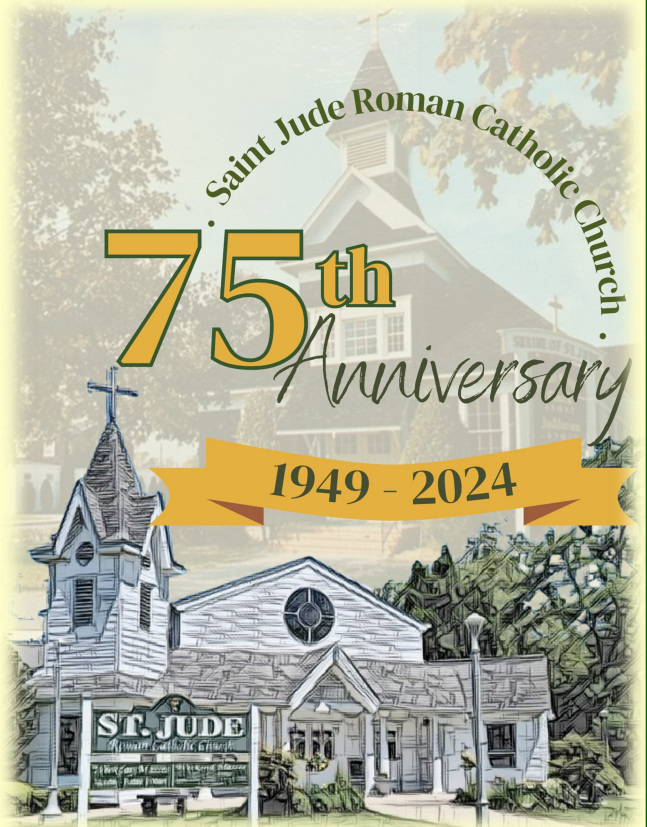

Modeling our Stewardship after Mary

Hail Mary full of Grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed are thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb Jesus. Holy Mary Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

When we think of May, we think of the beautiful flowers, beautiful weather and Mother's Day. How fitting that the month of May is dedicated to the Mother of Our Lord, and Our Mother—Mary. Throughout the world, through different cultures, and throughout different denominations, Mary is honored and held in high regard. God chose her to be the Mother of God and her humble “yes” is why we love and honor her. This month, let us model our stewardship after the one who displayed the pillars of stewardship throughout her whole life. Let us also remember that the purpose of building a strong foundation of stewardship in our life is to grow closer to Our Lord.

We can focus first on the Pillar of Formation. The Second Luminous Mystery of the Rosary, “The Wedding in Cana”, is from the Gospel of John and it can provide us a good example of how to build the Pillar of Formation in our lives. While Jesus and Mary were at the wedding, Our Lady overheard that the wine was running out. In order to help the couple and to ensure they had what they need, Mary interceded on their behalf to her Son. Her instruction to the wait staff was, “Do whatever He tells you.” We too should always be willing to intercede for those who need prayers and, like Mary, we should have the courage to remind our brothers and sisters to listen to Christ.

The next pillar is the Pillar of Service. Like in the wedding at Cana, Mary was at service to others but she also was always at service to God. Her “yes” to God should inspire us to always trust in God's will for us and have courage to go with His plan. How is God calling you to serve Him now? Perhaps it is to volunteer at your parish or to assist an elderly neighbor or friend. When we serve others, we serve God.

The Pillar of Hospitality is another pillar we can imagine that the Blessed Mother practiced in her life. Mary, like all the great saints, showed love to others (as she and they do now in Heaven). As Catholics, we are called to be hospitable, as we read in Matthew, “By their fruits you will know them.” This month, act in a way that will attract others to our Faith. Like Mary, care about those in need and always seek out God's will in every moment of your day. By doing so, you will be attracting those you come across to our Church and you will be bearing good fruits.

Finally, the Pillar of Prayer. There are so many beautiful and powerful prayers to Our Lady, some we know of and some we may never have heard. We invite you to dig deeper in your faith this month and perhaps pick up a new devotion to Mary. Perhaps you can pray the Rosary—it is such a powerful devotion; we strongly encourage you to pray it. Also learn about some other prayers that may be new to you—like the Regina Caeli.

May the Good Lord continue to bless you and your loved ones this month and may the Blessed Mother pray for you as well.

throughout the world. (1Cori 12 & 14), (Eph. 4:7-13)

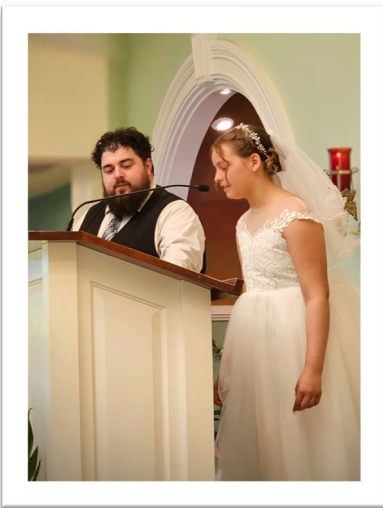
- Through the Indwelling Holy Spirit in believers, the fruit of the Holy Spirit is manifest (Gal. 5:22, 23)- characters of God's children.

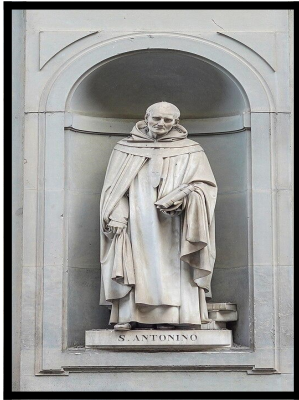

Dominican Saints and Blesseds to celebrate in May

St. Antoninus of Florence
Feast :May 10th



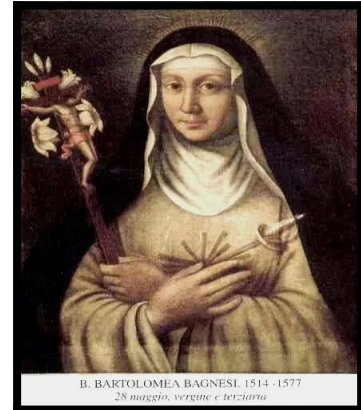
Born March 1st 1389 in Florence Italy. Antoninus was known for his piety and humility from a young age. He was often found kneeling before the crucifix in prayer. He was received into the Dominican order at age 16. Initially he was rejected due to his young age, but proved to have knowledge and a spirituality beyond his years. As bishop, he was a man of reform and of good counsel during confession. He died May 2nd, 1459. The Dominican order would like to see him elevated to Doctor of the Church. Saint Servatius appeared in a dream to a religious, warned him of the danger which threatened himself and his brethren, and directed them to flee to Maestricht; thus protector of the Order.

St. Servatius
Feast:May 13th or 22nd



Protector of Dominican Order
Born: Armenia 4th century
Patron against foot problems, rheumatism, lameness and against rats.
Servatius is a distant cousin to Jesus and John the Baptist. He served as priest and guardian to the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem. After a vision, he went to Tongres and succeeded Bishop Valentine. His relics are in Maastricht, Netherlands.

Bl. Mary Bartholomew Bagnesis-
Feast: May 28th



Born Aug. 15th, 1514 in Florence Italy. She was devoted to St Bartholomew the apostle and took his name. Neglected by her mother, she spent her time as a child in a Dominican cloister where her 4 sisters and the other nuns were very fond of her. Mary or “Marietta”[due to her small stature], was sickly and her father sought various treatments for 34 years. She longed to be a Dominican Nun, but could not due to her illness. In order to make his daughter happy, her father had a priest come to the house and Mary was entered into the Lay Dominican order. This priest remained her confessor for the next 22 years. Marietta died May 28th, 1577. She was Beatified in 1804. Patron of loss of parents, sick people, and victims of abuse.

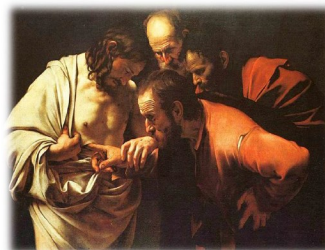

DR. JEN DEMARCO

Dr. Jen DeMarco, DO is a pro-life family medicine physician specializing in women's health and infertility. While practicing family medicine in private practice for over 20 years, Dr DeMarco pursued a certification in Women's Health and Infertility at the Saint Pope Paul VI Institute. In addition to her private practice, Dr DeMarco is also the Director of the Gianna Center for Women's Health and Fertility, located in Rockville Centre.

Dr. DeMarco raised her four children as a single mother after her marriage was severely impacted by addiction. She credits her Catholic faith and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit for informing her choices and empowering her vocation as a single mom and a physician.
