St. Vincent de Paul

In light of Vincent's regular practice of taking the imitation of Jesus Christ as the model of behavior, the saint, in Jesus' manner, chose the words of this Gospel: "He has sent me to bring good news to the poor," as the motto of his life and ministry. Jesus modeled doing before teaching. Accordingly, Vincent noted that Jesus first integrated "fully into his life every type of virtue." That was his preparation, after which our Lord, then went on to teach, by preaching the good news of salvation to poor people, and by passing on to his apostles and disciples what they needed to know to become guides for others. As followers of Vincent, we must imitate Christ the Lord, first...imitate his virtues and then we can go out in service to the poor.

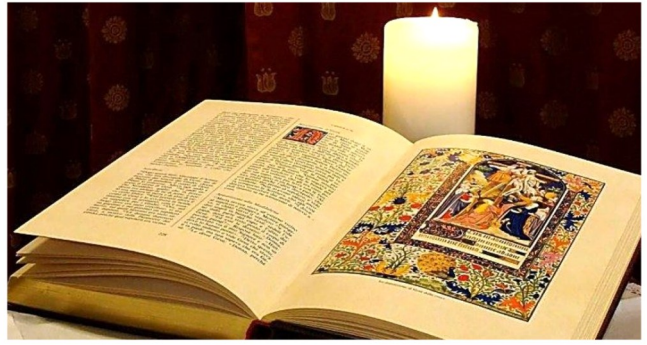

Sunday of the Word of God

Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter, Motu proprio "Aperuit illis", published on 30 September, establishes that "the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God". The timing of the document is significant: 30 September is the Feast of Saint Jerome, the man who translated most of the Bible into Latin, and who famously said: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ". This year also marks 1600 years since his death. The title of the document, "Aperuit illis", is equally important. They are its opening words, taken from St Luke's Gospel, where the Evangelist describes how the Risen Jesus appeared to His disciples, and how "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures".



A response to requests

Recalling the importance given by the Second Vatican Council to rediscovering Sacred Scripture for the life of the Church, Pope Francis says he wrote this Apostolic Letter in response to requests from the faithful around the world to celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God.

The Bible is for all

The Bible is not meant for a privileged few, continues Pope Francis. It belongs "to those called to hear its message and to recognize themselves in its words". The Bible cannot be monopolized or restricted to select groups either, he writes, because it is "the book of the Lord's people, who, in listening to it, move from dispersion and division towards unity".

Sacred Scripture and the Sacraments

The Pope uses the scene of the Risen Lord appearing to the disciples at Emmaus to demonstrate what he calls "the unbreakable bond between Sacred Scripture and the Eucharist". Since the Scriptures everywhere speak of Christ, he writes, "they enable us to believe that His death and resurrection are not myth but history, and are central to the faith of His disciples".

When the sacraments are introduced and illumined by God's Word, explains the Pope, "they become ever more clearly the goal of a process whereby Christ opens our minds and hearts to acknowledge His saving work".

The role of the Holy Spirit

"The role of the Holy Spirit in the Scriptures is primordial", writes Pope Francis. "Without the work of the Spirit, there would always be a risk of remaining limited to the written text alone". The Pope continues: "This would open the way to a fundamentalist reading, which needs to be avoided, lest we betray the inspired, dynamic and spiritual character of the sacred text". It is the Holy Spirit who "makes Sacred Scripture the living word of God, experienced and handed down in the faith of His holy people".

Pope Francis invites us never to take God's Word for granted, "but instead to let ourselves be nourished by it, in order to acknowledge and live fully our relationship with Him and with our brothers and sisters".

Practicing mercy

The Pope concludes his Apostolic Letter by defining what he describes as "the great challenge before us in life: to listen to Sacred Scripture and then to practice mercy". God's Word, writes Pope Francis, "has the power to open our eyes and to enable us to renounce a stifling and barren individualism and instead to embark on a new path of sharing and solidarity".

The Letter closes with a reference to Our Lady, who accompanies us "on the journey of welcoming the Word of God", teaching us the joy of those who listen to that Word – and keep it.

I appreciate the change of seasons, enjoying the summer months more so than these winter days that are upon us now. Today we are celebrating and reflecting on the importance of the Bible in our lives.

The Word of God nourishes and strengthens our spiritual lives just like physical food nourishes our bodies. Interiorly the Word of God has the power to transform our lives, to beckon us to change the things we need to change. Winter is a change from Fall, but it will lead into the change we will see in the Spring with its budding of plants, flowers, and new life in the natural landscape surrounding us. The Word of God is powerful and acts accordingly to those who take the time to embrace it, whether it be a passage from the Gospels, a Psalm, or perhaps meditating on one of Paul's letters.

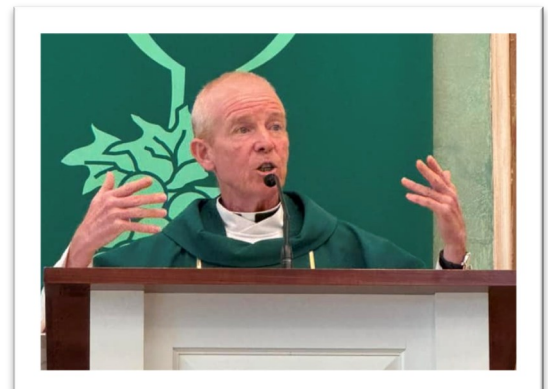
Yes, it can challenge us to examine our hearts, repent of our sins, and strive to live according the will of God. So, these winter days give us a new opportunity to be open to the beauty and awe within each of us. This is a season of more solitude that sometimes we don't realize its opportunity, like a God given gift that we let pass by. "The Word of God is living and effective, sharper than a two edged sword, able to pierce both bone and marrow, spirit and soul, and discern the thoughts of the heart" (Heb 4:12).

It is wonderful to know that many of you have been partaking in Fr. Kline's Bible Study every Friday here at St. Jude. I want to thank Fr. Kline for bringing the Word of God to us and I encourage all who have the time to drop by our Parish Center every Friday morning at 10:00 ~ all are welcome. And for all of us celebrating the Word of God Sunday may we make the effort and time to open our Bibles. God surprises us with a passage or chapter that seems to be speaking to us personally time and time again.

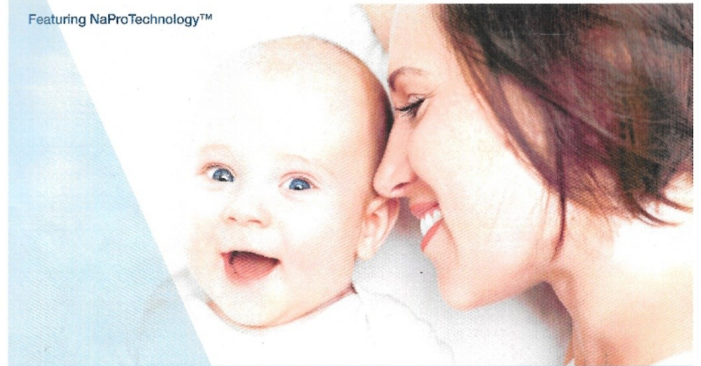
